

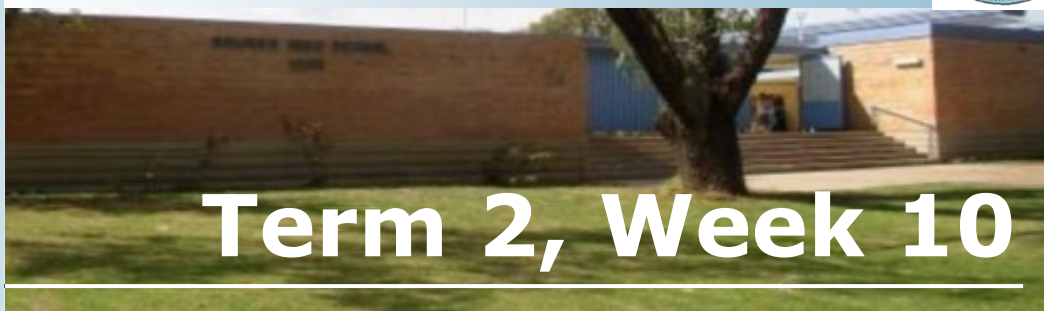


Education

Deputy Principal's Report



While this week is the last week of term, it is also a week where we recognise and celebrate something incredibly significant, both to our community and Australians across the nation: NAIDOC Week. This year, NAIDOC Week examines and celebrates the contributions of women through the lens "Because of her, we can". At a previous school assembly, I encouraged all students to carefully consider the impact of women in their everyday lives, and to consider how these women have shaped the people they have become.

In considering the theme of NAIDOC, I look at the strong young women we have in our school. Amongst our students we have girls and young women who are already leaders in their peer groups, who have tremendous influence in their sphere. Women, and how we treat women, can change a society dramatically. There is clear evidence that communities with better educated women have improved health, social and economic outcomes. 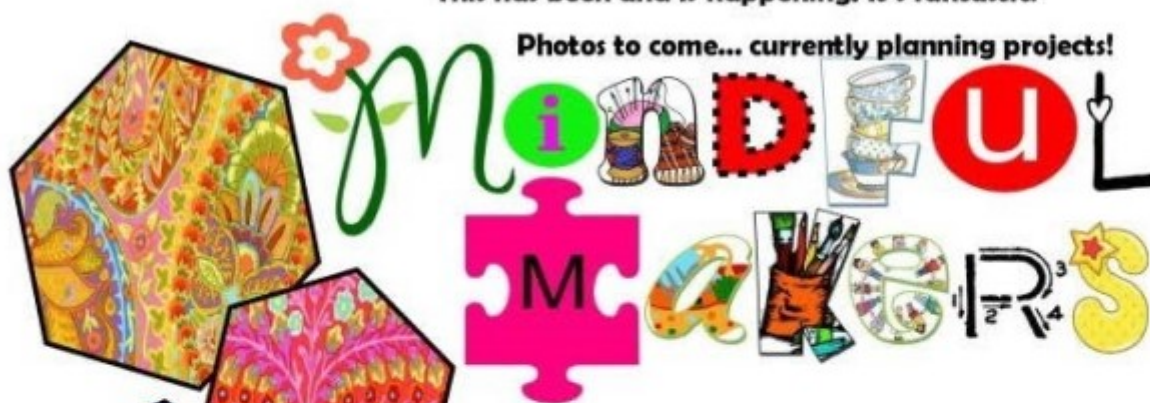

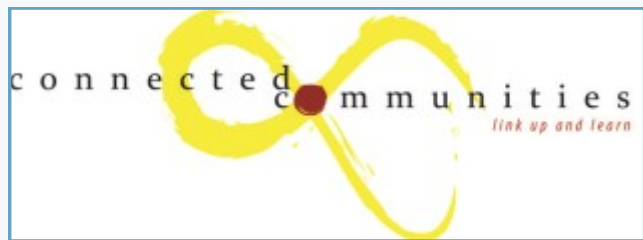
